Galloping To Give encourage all clients to adhere to the following regulations:

- **HANDS** - Wash your hands regularly and for 20 seconds in advance of your arrival
- **FACE** - Wear a face covering in indoor settings where social distancing may be difficult, and where you will come into contact with people you do not normally meet.
- **SPACE** - Stay 2 metres apart from people you do not live with where possible

If you have coronavirus symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

- Indoor contact will be limited as the majority of the time spent at morning on the gallops tours will be outside
- Galloping To Give will at all times be sensitive to the numbers involved in the tours however as these are for work purposes then we are permitted to be above the current 'rule of six' as advised by the Government.
- We will ensure at least one person in each group provides their contact details so that you can be contacted if needed by the [NHS Test and Trace programme](#).
